

## Viking Settlers Hazard Identification Sheet

Hazard identification sheets are provided by Ryedale Folk Museum are intended to support and facilitate museum staff in the delivery of our education offer. Our risk assessments can be used by visiting group leaders and assistants to support and underpin, but not to replace, their own hazard identification process or risk assessments.

Fire	Physical injury, missing participants	High	Safety briefing to visiting parties. Education lead Visiting children to be supported at all times by visiting staff. Visiting staff Activity leaders to lead their group to the designated safe place. Activity leaders Groups on self-explore are to follow the direction of official museum staff to lead their group to the designated safe place. Visiting staff Visiting groups must carry out a head count once at the designated safe place. Visiting staff Museum staff must be notified of missing party members. Animal enclosures	Bites	Med	Safety briefing to visiting parties. Education lead Children to be supervised by their support staff at all times. Visiting staff.	Low
Viking home- low lighting	Slips, trips, falls and bangs	Low	Safety briefing. Activity leader.	Low
Viking home– quern stone	Trapped fingers	Med	Safe demonstration of use. Activity leader.	Low
Viking home -uneven earth floor	Slips, trips and falls	Low	Safety briefing to visiting parties. Education lead.	Low

Viking home –broken items and tools in the stable area	Cuts, scrapes and physical injuries requiring minor first aid	Med	Equipment to be checked before use. Activity leader All breakages and damaged items to be reported to education lead. Activity leader All broken items to be replaced/ removed. Education lead. Stable to be checked and tools to be stored safely. Activity leader. Safety briefing regarding tools given to children who enter the stable. Activity leader Visiting staff are to support the delivery of minor first aid if required. Accident form to be completed. Visiting staff and education lead.	Low
Viking home – open fire	Burns and potential risk of large fire	High	Fires to be lit by trained staff. Activity leader Fires to be attended at all times. Activity leader Children to be briefed on fire safety before entering the building. Activity leader Children to be supervised by their support staff at all times. Visiting staff. Visiting staff are to support the delivery of minor first aid if required. Accident form to be completed. Visiting staff and education lead. All museum staff trained on fire evacuation procedure. Education lead In the event of a fire, visiting staff are responsible for the individual safety of their children and must follow the directions given by their activity leader or other museum staff member.	Med
Viking home – allergies to bread and honey snack	Allergic reaction	High	Visiting schools to notify the education leader of any allergies they are aware of. Visiting staff and education lead. A full list of ingredients can be provided on request. Visiting staff are to support the delivery of minor first aid if required. Accident form to be completed. Visiting staff and education lead.	Med
Viking home – cleanliness of the items used to prepare the snack	Cross-contamination and illness	Med	All museum staff will be trained appropriately. Education lead All equipment stored and cleaned before use. Activity leader Food safety diary completed. Activity leader. Hand sanitiser provided for participant use. Activity leader	Low
Fleece into fabric – using carders	Cuts, scrapes and physical injuries	Med	Safe demonstration of use. Activity leader Visiting staff are to support the delivery of minor first aid if required. Accident form to be completed. Visiting staff and education lead.	Low
Pottery – broken tools	Cuts, scrapes and physical injuries requiring minor first aid	Med	Equipment to be checked for safety before use. Activity leader Visiting staff are to support the delivery of minor first aid if required. Accident form to be completed. Visiting staff and education lead.	Low

COVID-19 Specific Measures – activity leaders are responsible for all outlined measures.

Fleece to fabric	Transmission through touched surfaces and materials	Low	Any wool not used discarded after session. Each child to have their own weaving card. Yarn removed from drop spindles, small amount put on and removed. Spindles wiped down between groups. Combs cleaned after each session.	Low
Exploring the Viking Home (Crofter's Cottage)	Transmission through touched surfaces and materials	Low	Handling objects are brought to the cottage and therefore not touched by any other visitors. Objects are cleaned between sessions. The beds and bedding are no longer explored physically. Role play with 'pretend' objects is utilised wherever possible. Dressing up clothes are eliminated or quarantined for a minimum of six days.	Low
Pottery	Transmission through touched surfaces and materials	Low	All utensils cleaned between groups. Each child has a shaping board, washed between each school group. Gloves and face covering to be worn by person preparing clay.	Low
